SYNOPSIS

In a near-future Philippines where people have lost the ability to dream, Elenita, a middle-aged call center agent, is paid in "dream-time". She uses this to relive her glory days as a rising pop diva. As she immerses deep into her fantasies, guilt and regrets from her past begin to emerge while her waking life unravels, straining her relationship with her daughter. Elenita must choose between chasing her lost dreams and confronting reality, or risk losing the person dearest to her.

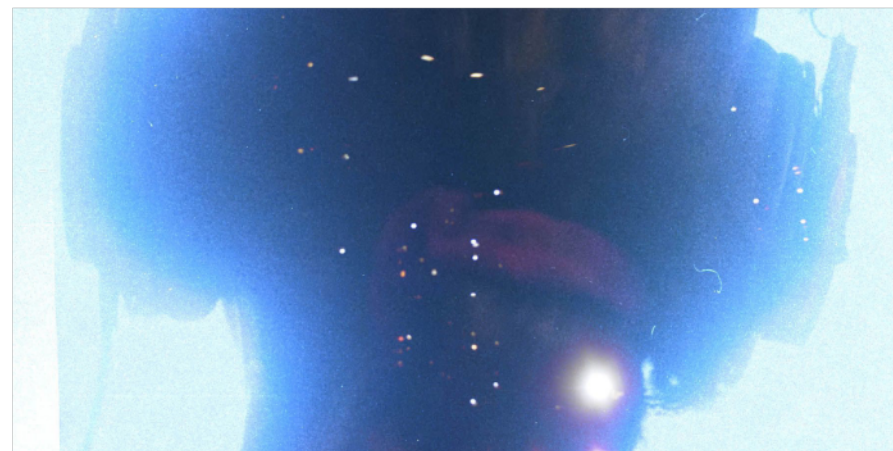
DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

A psychological drama that reimagines reality while focusing on the very real repercussions of outsourced labor exploitation on family dynamics in neocolonial Philippines. Using elements of science fiction to frame a deep character study of a woman reconciling her present self with lost ruminations of her past, this film is my processing of a complex feminine identity within the microcosm of imperialism that is the Third World call center. As the daughter of a real-life call center agent, I saw the toll production-via-performance and confined corporate spaces could take on a woman's psyche, driving her to compromise her self-worth and ambition as I, too, reckoned with my place in a Filipino society generationally conditioned to constantly apologize. Please Bear With Me becomes, at its core, a declaration of love and solidarity to my mother and countless others like her: invisible workers with dreams so deserving to be seen.

DIRECTOR GABRIELA SERRANO



Gabriela Serrano (b. 1996) is a Filipina director, editor, and audiovisual artist. She is interested in deeply introspective stories that deconstruct form and reimagine futures in her native Philippines. Her award-winning directorial debut DIKIT, a split-screen depiction of Filipino folklore, feminine anger, and dreams, has screened in festivals worldwide and joins the Criterion Channel this May. She continues her exploration of dreams in women's spaces through the call center sci-fi drama PLEASE BEAR WITH ME, her first full length film in development, recipient of the SGIFF Southeast Asian Film Lab Fellowship, the BIFAN NAFF Asian Discovery Award, a Sitges FanPitch selection, and the FNC Prix du Nouveau Marché. She is working on two new shorts: a companion piece to PLEASE BEAR WITH ME spanning three decades, and a tropical mystery that takes place over the course of three days.

SYNOPSIS

BONG, a young man deprived of means to give a decent burial for his wife, robs a small rural bank where BING works as a teller and takes her as hostage, unaware that she desperately wants to die. While the authorities scramble to resolve the crime and the townspeople transform the area into a marketplace, Bong succumbs to the thought of surrender, but Bing stops him. They proceed to ask for the burial of Bong's wife. The town chief informs Bong that they are ready to fulfill his demands, while Bing and Bong reach a new agreement. As Bong raises his hands to surrender, a shot is fired. As the town celebrates the rescue of Bing, she fulfills her dream of flying.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

BING. BONG. BANG. started out as an outlet — a rush of confusion of feeling and thought that needed to manifest itself and come to form. It came at a time in my life when nothing made sense except the thought of disappearing, but my mind wanted one final attempt to make sense of things before giving up on existence. This film is that attempt, and I would like to believe that writing this story saved me. Bing and Bong are polar opposites — the former a symbol of defeat, and the latter an image of persistence. Both are admirable and pitiful at the same time, and they both acknowledge this in each other in a moment of understanding and connection that makes life worthwhile, however temporary. This film is my attempt at understanding life as a constant attempt at understanding, and with this film, I hope to try and make sense of life and all there is that keeps me here.

DIRECTOR KRISTIN PARREÑO BARRAMEDA



Kristin Parreño Barrameda is a Filipino filmmaker. She worked as a copywriter for advertising, before eventually moving to film work as a screenwriter and post-production supervisor. She is a fellow of the Ricky Lee Scriptwriting Workshop and the TBA Writers' Room.

Her works have been screened in a number of international film festivals, including Cairo, Busan, Pyongyang, Osaka, and New York, to name a few. She participated in the 2019 SGIFF Southeast Asian Film Lab and received the Residency prize for her first feature film project BING. BONG. BANG. She also recently participated in the first edition of FLY Post Lab spearheaded by the Busan Film Commission.



PRODUCER E DEL MUNDO



E del Mundo is the recipient of the Philippine National Commission for Culture and the Arts' Ani ng Dangal Award for Cinema. While at Studio Operations in Warner Bros., she was among the women selected for the Women in Film's Mentor Circle in LA. Upon returning to the Philippines, she

transitioned to becoming one of the most respected film producers in the country, helping create films like Filipino Auteur Lav Diaz's THE HALT which had its world premiere at the 72nd Cannes Film Festival. She produced Netflix Philippines' first animated film by Avid Longren, HAYOP KA!, then the Netflix Original by Alessandra de Rossi, MY AMANDA, and the platform's first Filipino series, Antoinette Jadaone's REPLACING CHEF CHICO. She most recently produced Sigrid Bernardo's NOTHING LIKE PARIS for Amazon Prime.

SYNOPSIS

In the quiet realm of a hotels' night shift, a college dropout observes intimate moments on surveillance: from lovers' embraces to sex-workers retouching makeup in the elevators. Amidst this voyeuristic routine, his loneliness deepens, shared by countless twenty-somethings worldwide. His interactions with a mysterious woman, who frequents the hotel with different companions, add complexity. Discreetly supplying condoms to her room, he earns tips, forging an unspoken connection. A COVID outbreak in Wanhua leads to a Level 3 alert, shutting the hotel. She disappears. Jobless, he isolates himself, shedding silent tears as he stares at his reflection in the mirror.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

I once worked at a late-night hotel in Ximending. The choice was simple - higher pay, the freedom to do my own things during the night shift, be it reading or watching movies with the manager's approval. There was minimal interaction with colleagues, and occasional conversations in English foreigners sparked the imagination of leaving Taiwan to explore the world. As time passed, I found myself gradually confined by this job. Perhaps it was the result of constant night shifts, where moments of clarity coincided with the majority's slumber. There were no one to talk with, no friends, spending most of the time in solitude and silence – a time when youth was devoted to making ends meet. It seemed that the opportunity to appreciate the beauty of youth was lost, aging prematurely, diverging from the mainstream trajectory of society. Now, at the age of thirty-four, I attempt to revisit this past memory and use film to resurrect it, questioning within: Why?

SYNOPSIS

Hao (22) is propelled into a military island for a year of mandatory service. The wimpy schoolboy needs to survive and establish his authority in this barbaric world, even if it means betraying his best friend, Xiang (19). After Xiang's disappearance, Hao realizes how important Xiang means to him. But his revolt only leads him to lose everything by the end of the year.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

In our early twenties, Taiwanese young men are propelled into the military world for a year of mandatory service. In the barracks, we prepare a war to "defeat the communist thugs" and "reclaim China". Lost between two realities, the young minds are gradually worn out in this absurd, Kafkaesque world. Eventually, this military year turns out to be a collective trauma shared by all Taiwanese young men. And so, based on my personal experience, I'm sharing a story of a Taiwanese young man, who struggles to keep his sanity in this crazy world, attempts to live his youth, only to be crushed when this military dream comes to an end. This is a story about my youth, our generation, and the unspeakable dilemma of our country. Through the main character's journey, I try to understand how an invisible war infiltrate into the Taiwanese military world, and lead our young men's fates to a tragic end.

SYNOPSIS

Hoon, a 38-year-old Korean living in Tokyo, and his Japanese wife Anna struggle to balance their cultural differences while raising two daughters on one income. They often argue about whether to have a third child or move to a more affordable neighbourhood. Meanwhile, Hiromi, a successful businesswoman, is unaware of Ken's loneliness as a full-time househusband and is puzzled when he disappears one day, but tries to maintain her own job and lifestyle instead of going looking for him. Hun and Hiromi meet by chance at a cider pub where foodies gather in Tokyo, and are reacquainted in Aomori, an apple-growing region, where they unexpectedly complement each other's stuck lives.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

This work explores real happiness in today's society, which for me, is crystallized in a bottle of apple cider. My fascination with cider began in 2007 while studying in the UK, where I tasted it for the first time. During the COVID-19 pandemic, I bought cider to support a Japanese importer and connected with cider makers worldwide. This sparked my interest in how they live modestly, in harmony with nature, and within tight-knit communities. Tasting cider is like a journey, and this film mirrors that journey, delving into the protagonists' minds as they navigate tough emotional conflicts and make life choices.

SYNOPSIS

Hung, a stuck-up filmmaker, returns home for his high school reunion. On the way back, Hung meets the old artists of a struggling Film Studio, who offer advice and empty promises of help to him. Frustrated, Hung wanders around and follows a mysterious girl to an abandoned movie studio. They witness magical scenes through the studio's void like a large movie screen. At the reunion, where an event is happening; cars created a giant map of Vietnam on the beach. Hung gets drunk and wanders off. Wakes up on a beach full of trash. Hung meets a famous director but he can't recognize him. In the distance, prostitutes are riding bicycles gracefully. These surreal experiences challenge his creativity.

DIRECTOR'S STATEMENT

My cinematic journey began with black and white movies on family TV, mostly from Socialist Republics including works by Vietnam Film Studio (VFS). VFS's war and post-war films often serve propaganda and educational purposes. However, with the advent of video and alternative entertainment options in the late 90s and early 2000s, VFS struggled to maintain its audience. In 2017, the government sold 80% of VFS to a logistics company, worsening unemployment among filmmakers. Pursuing independent filmmaking in Vietnam is challenging amid economic and cultural changes. The main character Hung embodies the young artist's struggle against a changing landscape. The story explores themes of purpose, blending historical and cultural elements with a chaotic urban setting. Characters like the Cowboy and the Swordsman add mystery, while humour infuses portraits of Vietnamese artists caught between tragedy and comedy in their quest to find relevance in a changing world. grow rapidly.
